This created a blind intersection when approaching the Blvd. from S. Hermosa. I have reached out to City Hall to bring this to their attention. The last response was that it is an involved process to put a stop sign at this intersection. However, they are considering removing 1 or 2 parking spaces by painting the curb red.

A preferred fix would be a stop sign as there is a lot of pedestrian traffic due to the park's events, the church and business' in this area. Although, removing 1 or 2 parking spits would probably help eliminate the blind situation.

I have a previously scheduled meeting this evening and am unable to attend the City Council Meeting in person. I would like to make public comments on 2 agenda items.

Discussion-

1. Given that the California State Library Targeted Grant and California State Library Building Forward Infrastructure Grant will expire on March 31, 2026, and that library staff will require 90 days to move into the renovated building, it's crucial that we proceed with construction. I urge the City Council to approve the recommended award of general contractor services, including the allocation of funds from the General Funds Reserve. Delaying this project puts our grant funds at risk, and we must make significant progress to ensure their preservation.

2. I would like to express my support for the formation of an Ad Hoc Committee for Library Meaningful Improvement Project Communications. Time is of the essence, and it is essential that stakeholders are better informed about the timelines and progress of the current project as we move forward.
